A. New Connections - Establishment of telephone service or subsequent additions to telephone service. No distinction is made between a new installation and an "outside move".

C. Outside Moves - All moves of service made from one building to another. Any move of a customer's portable structure containing Company equipment or service is also considered an outside move. (T)

1.2 Service Charges are in addition to any other scheduled rates and charges normally applying under this tariff. They apply in addition to an not in lieu of Initial Nonrecurring Charges (I.N.C.) or Construction Charges made because of unusual cost in establishing service.

1.3 The charges specified herein do not contemplate work being performed by Company employees at a time when overtime wages apply, due to the request of the customer; nor do they contemplate work once begun being interrupted by the customer. If the customer requests overtime labor being performed or interrupts work once begun, a charge in addition to the specified charges will be made equal to the additional cost involved.

SERVICE CHARGES (Continued)

1.4 Service Charges for the initial establishment of telephone service are payable at the time application is made for the particular service or facility, and prior to the establishment of service.

1.5 Service Charges are applicable for the following work functions required to establish, add to, move or change telephone service:

A. Service Ordering Charge - Receiving, recording and processing information necessary to execute a customer's request for service.

B. Line Connection Charge - Performing all or part of the operations associated with the connection of a central office line. These include, but are not limited to, establishing or changing central office connections and cable cross connections, line and station transfers, and connecting the entrance facilities. Where for service reasons the Company decides to terminate a central office line adjacent to the cable terminal, that work is covered by the Line Connection Charge.

C. Premises Visit Charge - The charge that applies for a visit to the customer's premises to perform work, other than disconnect work, requested by the customer. When more than one visit is necessary for Company reasons, to complete the work, only one Premises Visit Charge applies.

1. General

- a. The Lifeline Program is a federally funded program established to provide monthly assistance to low-income households. Eligible subscribers may receive a discount on monthly local exchange access service of \$1.75. In addition, the Federal subscriber line charge will be waived for a total credit of the current federal subscriber line charge plus \$1.75. The current Federal subscriber line charge can be found by referencing NECA F.C.C. Tariff #5, Section 17 or by contacting our business office.
- b. The eligibility criteria for the Lifeline Program shall be the same as that provided under the Link-Up Program as specified in Paragraph A.1.b., c. and d. above.
- c. Lifeline service shall not be disconnected for nonpayment of toll charges.
- d. Qualifying low-income subscribers who voluntarily elect toll blocking, where available, will not be required to pay a service deposit in order to initiate Lifeline service. This service will only be provided at the customer's request.

1.6 Link Up Program (cont'd)

- G. A participant in the Link-Up Program shall have the option to defer payment of the remaining installment charges over a minimum period of twelve months. Monthly payments to retire the outstanding balance shall be required, but no interest or carrying charges shall apply.

1.7 Supplemental Assistance

- A. In addition to the fifty percent discount described in 1.6F above, a one time credit of up to 100% of the remaining connection charge will be applied to each new eligible subscriber, as defined in 1.6C above. (C)

- B. Customers wishing to participate in the funding of UTSAP may do so by electing to contribute, on a monthly basis, a fixed amount to be included by the Company on the customer's monthly bill. The voluntary contribution shall not reduce the customer's total monthly bill amount due the Company for telephone services or other charges. (C)

1.8 Lifeline Program

- A. General: The Lifeline Program is a federally funded program established to provide monthly assistance to low income households. Eligible subscribers may receive a discount on monthly local exchange access service of \$1.75. In addition, the Federal Subscriber Line Charge of \$3.50 will be waived for a total monthly credit of \$5.25.
- B. The eligibility criteria for the Lifeline Program shall be the same as that provided under the Link-Up Program as specified in Section 1.6(B) (C) and (D) above.

1.10 Universal Service Support Plan for Health Care Providers

Public and non-profit health care providers as defined in 47 CFR, Section 54.601 shall be eligible for this universal service support plan for health care providers (Plan). Services covered by the Plan are all telecommunications services. However, those with a bandwidth capacity are limited to a bandwidth capacity of 1.544 Mbps or less.

Services purchased pursuant to this Plan shall not be resold.

Plan provisions and eligibility are as detailed in 47 CFR beginning with Section 54.601.

B. Prices

The amount of universal service support for an eligible service provided to a rural health care provider shall be the difference, if any, between the urban rate and the rural rate charged for the service, as defined within these rules.

Plan discounts/support are as detailed in 47 CFR, Section 54.605, 607 and 609.

**1.11 DIGITAL DIVIDE ELIMINATION FUND PROGRAM**

1. Digital Divide Elimination Fund Program is created as a special fund in the State Treasury to foster elimination of the Digital Divide and shall be used, subject to appropriation, by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs to fund community technology centers and for assisting public hospitals, libraries, and park districts in eliminating the digital divide. All monies in the Fund will be collected by the Company and remitted to the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs, who will issue grants to the various communities based upon their needs.

**1.1 General**

- A. Customers wishing to participate in the funding of the Program may do so by electing to contribute, on a monthly basis, a fixed amount to be included on the customer's monthly bill. This contribution shall not reduce the customer's total amount due for telecommunications service or other charges appearing on the bill.
- B. This contribution will be a line item on the bill and identified as the "Digital Divide Fund".
- C. Contributions shall be collected on a recurring basis each month from the customer's bill and remittance shall be reported and transferred to the Department or its designee as required by Section 758.60.
- D. Customers may elect to contribute \$.50, \$1.00, \$2.00, \$5.00, \$10.00, \$15.00, or \$25.00 per month per line
- E. Customers may elect to discontinue or change the amount of the monthly contribution on their bill at any time upon providing at least 30 days notice by telephone or mail to the company.
- F. Failure by the customer in any month to remit the entire bill amount may reduce the contribution accordingly.

The Digital Divide Elimination Fund is mandated by the Illinois Commerce Commission and is created as a special fund in the State Treasury effective July 10, 2002. All monies in the Fund shall be used by the Illinois Department of Commerce and Community Affairs to fund community technology centers and for assisting public hospital, libraries, and park districts in eliminating the digital divide. The monies will be collected by the Company and remitted to the Department of Commerce and Community Affairs, who will issue grants to the various communities based upon their needs.

- B. Additional Service Ordering Charges are applicable for subsequent requests by a customer for work to be done except under the following conditions:
  - (1) Requests which can readily and conveniently be included on the same service order(s).
  - (2) Additional service requested by the customer which can readily be completed by the person on the job, which only requires corrections to the original order(s).
- C. For residence and business exchange service, one Service Ordering Charge is applicable where all the work or service is ordered at the same time for the same account and is performed or provided on the same premises.
- D. Unless otherwise specified, the appropriate Service Ordering Charge is applicable for a customer order for equipment or service, and is in addition to any other nonrecurring charges which may be applicable for the equipment or service furnished.
- E. The Service Ordering Charge for record work only is applicable for the following customer requests which do not involve central office or premises work:
  - (1) Changes or additions involving Directory Listings or Joint User Service.

## 3.2 Line Connection Charge

However, when service and facilities are assumed prior to discontinuance and without lapse in rendition of or charges and payment for service, in the case of change in responsibility for payment for service, no Line Connection Charges are applicable.
- D. Line Connection Charges are applicable for rearrangements of each single span of aerial drop wire or equivalent underground entrance facilities.

## 3.3 Premises Visit Charge

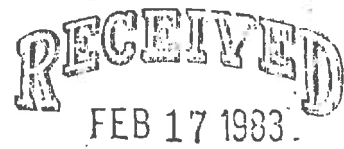
